- All shortlisted applicants are invited to attend GCU for a half day selection visit prior to an offer of a place on the BSc Hons Physiotherapy programme being made.
- You will be welcomed by the Programme Leader on arrival and introduced to the course. Current students will be available to take you on a tour of our excellent City Centre campus, School facilities and Caledonian Court accommodation. They will also be able to answer any questions you may have relating to student life. It is vital that you not only meet the academic requirements but also demonstrate the personal attributes required for a career in physiotherapy. The selection process includes a Multi Mini Interview (MMI) which will evaluate your professional suitability, communication and team working skills.
- The aim of an MMI is to assess your interpersonal skills, your knowledge of the profession and your ability to work as part of a team. You should aim to demonstrate your motivation to study physiotherapy and your positive personal attributes. This is in line with Values Based Interviews which take place within the Health Services to determine whether you are ideally suited to a career in physiotherapy. You will take part in group exercises with your peers and service users. An individual interview with a member of academic and a practising physiotherapist will complete the visit. While you are with us on campus you will have the chance to find out more about studying here at GCU, the support services available and student finance.
